CAPTAIN JULIANA M. STRIETER EXECUTIVE OFFICER, NAVAL FACILITIES ENGINEERING SYSTEMS COMMAND, WASHINGTON

Captain Strieter is a native of Lake Linden, MI, and enlisted in the Navy in December 1995. During her time at Nuclear Field Electronic Technician A-School, she completed her degree and graduated from Michigan Technological University in 1996 with a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering. She was selected for Officer Candidate School (OCS) in the Civil Engineer Corps Community where she was commissioned as an Ensign in July 2000. In May 2009, she received a Master of Engineering in Project Management from the University of Maryland.

CAPT Strieter's enlisted tours include basic training in Great Lakes, Nuclear Field Electronic Technician A-school, Nuclear Power School, Naval Nuclear Power Training Unit and USS DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER (CVN 69) serving in the Reactor Controls Division where she qualified as Reactor Operator and Shutdown Reactor Operator.

Strieter's first assignment was with Atlantic Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command as the Assistant Contingency Engineer and Reserve Liaison Officer for Engineering Field Activity, Atlantic (EFALANT) followed by a tour of duty with Naval Mobile Construction Battalion FOUR where she deployed with the battalion to the Middle East in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. During her tour with NMCB FOUR, she served as the Charlie Company Commander and Assistant Training Officer. She then completed a tour with the Resident Officer in Charge of Construction (ROICC), Sewells Point as an AROICC. She also completed tours with NAVFAC MIDLANT as the NAVSTA Norfolk Airfield Assistant Public Works Officer; Executive Assistant to the Deputy Chief of Civil Engineers at Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Washington D.C.; Officer in Charge, Naval Support Unit, Department of State; XO of Naval Construction Training Center Gulfport; Public Works Department Deveselu where she has the distinction of being the first permanent party stationed at Naval Support Facility Deveselu; Director, Maritime Headquarters and Force Maintenance Officer of Task Force Five Six/Navy Expeditionary Combat Forces Central; Public Works Officer at Naval Station Mayport; Facilities Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization Analyst to the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations.

Currently, CAPT Strieter is assigned to Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command, Washington as the Executive Officer.

She is a qualified Seabee Combat Warfare Officer, a Professional Engineer in the Commonwealth of Virginia, Public Works Level III, DAWIA Contracting Level III and a member of the Acquisition Professional Community. Her decorations include Meritorious Service Medal (two awards), Navy Commendation Medal (seven awards), a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Good Conduct Medal, and various campaign and services awards.
